



Who May Operate a PWC

A person **younger than 14 years old** may not operate a PWC legally.

A person **14 or 15 years old** may operate a PWC **only if**:

- He or she is accompanied on board the PWC by a person who is at least 18 years old and who is in compliance with the requirements for operating a vessel **or...**
- He or she has on his or her person identification showing proof of age and a boating certification card showing proof of passing a **ABS Course (About Boating Safety)** approved by NASBLA and accepted by the North Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission

It is unlawful for the owner of the PWC to knowingly allow a person under the age of 16 to operate a PWC unless they meet the above requirements

GPS For Mariners

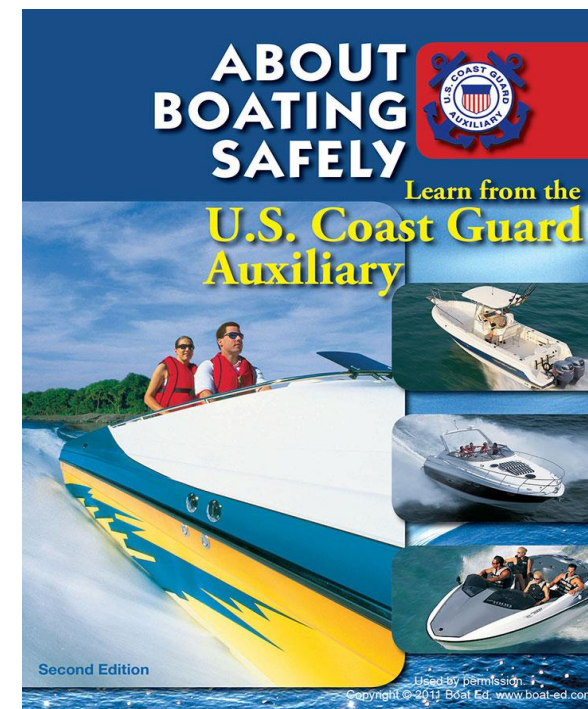
Focuses on the GPS equipment typically owned by the recreational boater

Who May Operate A Motor Vessel with 10hp & Greater

Any person born after 1/1/1988 who wants to operate a motor boat of 10 hp. + MUST

Complete & Pass a Boating Safety Course that is approved by the National Association of State Boating Law Administrators (NASBLA) and accepted by the Wildlife Resources Commission or has proof of other boating safety education in compliance with state laws G.S. 75A-16.2

To prove you have passed the above requirements you must:

- Carry on board his or her boater education certification card or other proof of compliance
- Make the card or other proof available upon request by an enforcement officer.

Courtesy Vessel Exams

Vessels passing safety checks are awarded a U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary Decal that informs Law Enforcement that your boat was in full compliance of all Federal and State Boating laws during a safety check for that year
In many cases boating insurance agencies offer discounts for vessels which undergo a Vessel Safety Check every year.
